Phase One

The talk for writing text in Nursery has been 'Jasper's Beanstalk' and in Reception it has been 'Jack and the Beanstalk' to fit in with the theme of growing. The children have been planting seeds and running garden centres in their role play, which they have really enjoyed.

Phase Two

In the afternoon, the children used the African masks to work co-operatively to participate in an African dance which they thoroughly enjoyed!

On Monday 6th March a group of Year 4 children went to Centenary Square in Bradford to be part of the flag raising ceremony for International Women's Day. It was an important occasion to heighten awareness of inspirational women across the world. Noreen Khan who is the Director of the NESSIE foundation took time to explain the importance International Women's Day to the children and recommended that all the children went home to hug their mums as they were likely to be the most inspirational women in their lives.

Phase Three

From the beginning of Spring term, Y5 have had the exciting opportunity to work with the Northern Ballet dance academy. Experts from the academy have been leading workshops with the children in
