Dear Parents and Carers,

As we draw to the end of a very busy Autumn term I would like to thank staff, parents and children all for that has been achieved. We have started the academic year 2016/17 really well and the children have been getting to grips with their learning.

We have taken part in many events to address the safety and wellbeing of our children including Road Awareness week where Margaret McMillan Children worked with pupils from St Cuthbert's and Lister Primaries to help keep Scotchman Road safe. The children also took part in cyber safety workshops, Healthy Choices week and National Anti-bullying Week.

We provide a broad curriculum and want it to be enriched and meaningful for the children. We do this through visits and visitors. This term our children have visited the post office, the Library and watched a production of the shoemakers wish. They have taken part in dinosaur workshops, Owl workshops, Greek day, Victorian day, Cyber safety workshops and Road Safety sessions.

We have held 2 very successful productions, the Eid production by years 3, 4, and 5 and more recently the Christmas production by Nursery, reception and years 1 and 2.

We also want our children to understand that we have a responsibility to help those less fortunate than ourselves and we have raised a massive £1556.73 this term for good causes such as Water aid (Eid production), Children in need, McMillan Cancer Support (McMillan coffee morning) and Save the Children (Christmas jumper day). We will be running new workshops in the Spring term and I urge you to attend if you are able. Parents also attended a meeting about our anti-bullying policy. Again, the feedback received was very positive, and I also sent a letter outlining the meeting and questions raised for those of you who missed it.

We have also been busy remodelling some rooms in school to provide much needed office space and a place for phase 3 children to work outside of class on interventions etc. They should be complete early in the new year.
