Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope your new year has started well. Things in school are as busy as ever and the children are getting on with their learning. I have had the rare privilege of teaching some classes over the past few weeks and I would like to commend the children on their learning behaviour and attitudes. Phase One

The Nursery team would like to thank all parents that have been attending rhyme time on a Friday. We are not getting many parents attending from Stars. The Early Years team would like to remind all parents that children should come in a warm coat everyday. Children have access to outdoor learning everyday in all weathers.

The year one team are still continuing to model activities that support the phonics screening test during parent play. Please continue to come when you drop your children off on a Wednesday morning. The children have been looking at materials and their properties over the half term. They will continue with this after the holidays. A builder will be coming into school to support this topic. Please talk to your child about different materials and their properties.

Phase Two

In Year 2 we have started our topic comparing the UK to Africa, so far we have learnt about Kenya, made posters about African animals and tasted some African fruit. Some children were really brave and tasted passion fruit even though it looked a bit slimy! Lots of children have brought in photos of when they were babies - we love seeing everyone's baby photos so keep them coming! We have seen big improvements in spelling test scores, thank you for helping your children learn their spellings. The children now need to focus on learning their 2, 5 and 10 times tables and division facts - Math Magician is a good website you can use to practise. We look forward to speaking to all the parents at parents evening this week.

Year 3 went to see the pantomime Cinderella at the Alhambra in Bradford and have been enjoying learning about it during their Literacy work.

We have also been learning how to play cricket with a Sports UK coach and some children will have the opportunity to go to a cricket festival later on in the half term.

On Friday 19th January the choir of Years 3 and 4 children went to Sheffield Arena , with a total of 5500 children from other schools to sing all the songs we have been learning in our singing lessons and choir club.

Year 4 have been busy learning all about why Bradford is such a cool place to live. We've already had the pleasure of visiting the famous Alhambra theatre this half term and felt very proud to be in such a wonderful building and a famous landmark of Bradford. The children were wonderfully behaved and enjoyed every moment of Cinderella which was thrilling from start to finish.

We have also been imagining life without electricity and discussing what the consequences of a sudden power cut would be. The children all agreed that it would be a disaster as they would be no iPhones or PlayStation 4s. The children have particularly enjoyed role playing parts of customers of representatives of the electric board. The teachers can already see who has got a glistening career in customer service ahead of them.



