



chalk	Chalk was used by teachers to write on the blackboard. It was mainly white but there many colours of chalk.	<input type="checkbox"/> Old toys were usually made from materials such as wood, metal, glass and fabric.	 
skipping	A very popular game in the 1960s. It was a long piece of rope which was turned by two children.	<input type="checkbox"/> Many new toys use electricity or batteries to move, make noise or light.	
marbles	Another popular game was marbles. Many children came to school with a pocketful of marbles.	<input type="checkbox"/> Old toys were made differently to how new toys are made.	
snakes and ladders	A board game which everyone knew in the 1960s. The board was made up of squares and you would move up a ladder and down the snake.	<input type="checkbox"/> An older toy may be a toy that your grandparents may have played with. A newer toy may be a toy that you might play with.	
ludo	Another very popular board game. It was played with a dice. Children would chase each other around the board.	<input type="checkbox"/> Lots of old toys were made of wood. These toys were all hand made. This meant that they took a long time to make.
