




Stone Age Year 3 Knowledge Mat

archaeologists	People who discover our history by looking at artefacts that have been found.	★ The Old Stone Age is called the Palaeolithic Age and started 2 and a half million years ago.	  
artefact	An object made by human beings, usually with historical or cultural interest.	★ Children in the Stone Age had a healthy diet; they ate mainly fresh fruits and meat.	
Farmers	A person who grows crops, uses tools and keeps animals.	★ The weather was very cold because there were areas that were still frozen. This is called an Ice Age .	
B.C.	Before Christ. The date 250BC means 250 years before Christ was born.	★ Stone Age humans even made jewellery! They would string pieces of shell together to make necklaces.	
chronology	The ordering of events, for example the Stone, Bronze and Iron Age.	★ Lots of animals existed in the Stone Age too; a hippopotamus and a hyena are two examples of non-extinct animals.	
tribal	Groups of people who live together.	What I need to know about the Stone Age	Important
hunter-gatherers	People who mainly live by hunting, fishing and gathering wild fruit.	<input type="checkbox"/> Star Carr is a Stone Age site in Yorkshire that has been used to find artefacts.	
shelter	A house where Stone Age people would have lived.	<input type="checkbox"/> The Stone Age was followed by the Bronze Age period. This is when humans started to use metal.	
civilization	When people live in a large society with a shared culture and rules.	<input type="checkbox"/> Cave paintings and settlements are used by archaeologists to understand how Stone Age man lived, worked and used art to tell stories.	
settlement	A place where there were several Stone Age shelters, like a small village.	<input type="checkbox"/> During the early Stone Age, people lived in caves, gathered food by hunting wild animals and birds, fishing, and collecting fruits and nuts.	
prey	An animal that is hunted for its food.	<input type="checkbox"/> Towards end of the Stone Age, the humans formed settled communities, and domesticated plants and animals for the first time in history.
