This weeks rhyme is 'Miss Polly had a dolly'. The challenges have been set around this nursery rhyme.

There are some activities to support your child. However you and your child can also create your own activities around the nursery rhyme.

5. Mirror activity

Look in the mirror and say 'Polly'. Look at the different shapes your mouth is making. Now look in the mirror and say your own name. Have you made different shapes this time with your mouth?



4. Make

Make a bed for dolly! You will need an empty box e.g. cereal, shoe

Cut the box into the shape of a bed and put your dolly in. Or you could make a dolly. Remember the dolly will need a blanket to keep her nice and warm!

1. Think of some actions

Sing the nursery rhyme with your child. Can you think of some actions for the rhyme?



2. Family role play

One person will dress up as a doctor, another as Miss Polly and finally a dolly! Can you find a hat and a bag for the doctor! The dolly will need a bed!

Now sing the nursery rhyme and maybe you could record it and show the teachers once you're back at school.

3. Music

Can you make the rat-a-tat-tat sound? You can find places to knock, does it make the same sound each time? You could knock quietly and see if anyone hears the sound or really loud!
