Glossary:

Linking concepts:

- Similarities & differences To find what is the same and what is different about two places
- Cause & consequence To find the reason why certain things happen and how this affects people/places
- Change & continuity To look at what has and has not changed over time
- Significance To look at the importance of information, data, maps and geographical features
- Interpretation To understand a range of data/information in order to make predictions and come up with own conclusions based on evidence

Geographical Skills

Geographical Enquiry

- Teacher led enquiries to ask and respond to simple closed questions.
- Enquiry questions to be displayed and explored at the beginning and end of the unit.
- Use information books or pictures as sources of information.
- Investigate their surroundings.
- Make observations about where things are e.g. within school or local area.

Locational and Place knowledge

Notice things in the place where I am and react to them by commenting

Human and physical geography

- Use secondary sources pictures, photos, stories, films to find out about a place.
- Children to tell you what a place is like in simple terms.

Using globes, maps and plans

- Children to play games with globes and maps.
- Draw simple picture maps, plans with labels of places they know or for imaginary places and stories.
 - Children start to use their own symbols.





Map Skills

• Follow directions: up, down, left and right.

Fieldwork

- Children to use some of their senses to observe places.
- Children to identify simple types of buildings and places around them and know their own special features.

Essential knowledge

- Children identify the type of building that they live in and that this building is different from school.
- Children talk about their journey to school.

- Children can talk about appropriate clothing for the season.
- Children can talk about the weather.
- Identify when it is hot and cold in Bradford.
